Sarah Elizabeth Buell-Jones

Sarah, only daughter of Jeremiah G. and Sarah Buell, was born at LeRoy, New York, August 12, 1846. She enjoyed the privileges of a Christian home, and united with the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1862, and continued in its communion until

1880. She was educated in the common schools, at Genesee Wesleyan Seminary, and at Ingham University.

On May 29, 1867, she was united in marriage with Frederick R. Jones at Spencerport, New York. They came to Hancock, Wisconsin, locating on a farm one mile north of this village, and there lived until retiring from active farm life in 1912 when they moved to Hancock and here spent the remainder of their days.

Our subject became the mother of five children: Edith R., who died Oct. 5, 1924; Emory B., of Hancock; Dora Haire, of Paris, Canada; the second daughter, Estella, died in infancy; the second son, Frank LeRoy, died April 14, 1906. Her husband, Frederick R. Jones, preceded her to the Better Land on Aug. 30, 1912.

Mr. and Mrs. Jones endured the hardships common to pioneers of this country and actively shared its development agriculturally and otherwise, being always interested in helpful and historical events in the march of progress.

About two years ago Mrs. Jones suffered a light paralytic stroke, and from then on her son and wife, Mr. and Mrs. E. B. Jones, made it their first duty at all times to supply "Mother" with every possible comfort and care. Her remarkable mind remained active and thoughtful for others almost to the last day of her long and useful life. She welcomed the end which came on Sunday morning, March 17, 1929.

Funeral services were well attended Tuesday afternoon at the Congregational church which she had faithfully attended and supported for two generations or more. Rev. Cook's remarks were highly appropriate to the life and work of this noble woman.
